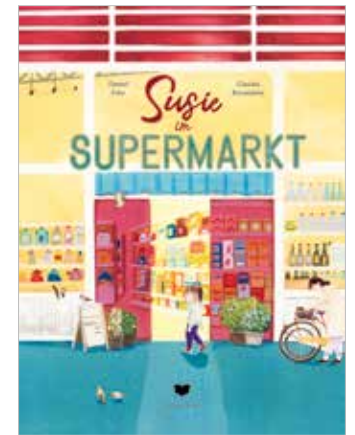

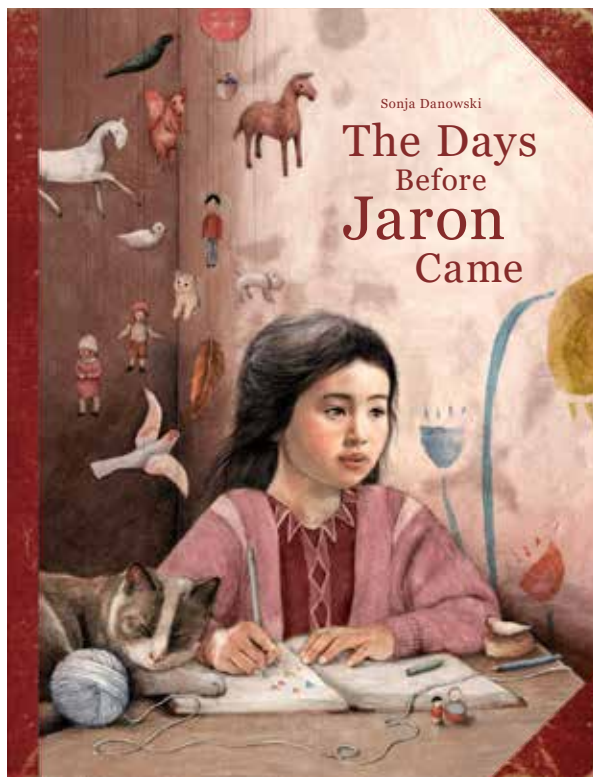

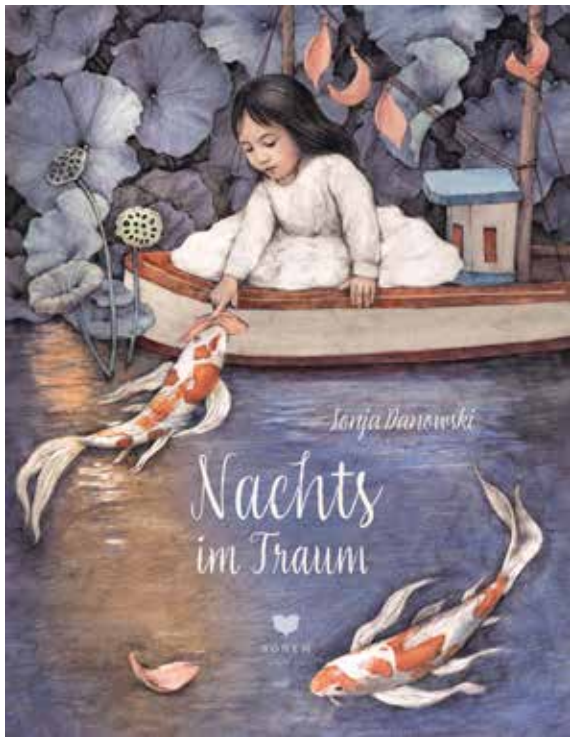


Jaron turns three today. He receives some nice presents, but what he longs for most is to hear his sister read from the diary she wrote before he was born.
